<p>Adult make a 100 square Point to a number – what is it? Repeat with different numbers. Count along to 30 and back. Revise 2D and 3D shapes Look at food packets in your kitchen and think of ways you can sort them eg things in tins, things I like, types of food. Make a set and draw it. Talk about the shapes of containers. Name the 3D shape. Can you see any 2D shapes?</p> <p>Draw around your hands. Label the left and the right hand. Play “Simon says” putting your left and right hand in different places. Repeat with left and right feet. Sing The Hokey Kokey</p> <p>Practise writing your numbers – remember they all start at the top! Watch Number blocks</p>	<p>Read a variety of books to your child every day and remember favourites will be requested again and again!</p> <p>Children should read to an adult daily.</p> <p>Read Hansel and Gretel</p>
