Weekly Maths Tasks (aim to do one per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (aim to do one per day)
<p>Count back from 20 Ask children to double 1, 2, 3, 4 Say a number and ask the children to point to a bigger number on the 100 square Pick a number on the 100 square and clap to that number Practise counting in 2s to 100 Practise saying days of the week and months of the year. What month is it now? What month is your birthday in? What day is it today? If you have it play Snakes and Ladders. Draw a snake, divide it into 25 segments. Play a game to see who can get to 25 first. Estimating – estimate far away things and how many footsteps it would take to get to there. Make a note of your estimate and actual steps taken. Play “What’s the time Mr Wolf” Make a clock. Learn ‘O’ clock and half past Make a number line (to 30) with some numbers missing, ask your child to fill in the missing numbers.</p> <p>Practise writing your numbers – remember they all start at the top!</p> <p>Watch Number blocks</p>	<p>Read a variety of books to your child every day and remember favourites will be requested again and again!</p> <p>Children should read to an adult daily.</p> <p>Read books with a food theme such as,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Little Red Hen• The Very Hungry Caterpillar• Olivers Vegetables• Handas Surprise• Ketchup on my cornflakes• I went to the Zoopermarket• The magic porridge pot
