Weekly Maths Tasks (aim to do one per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (aim to do one per day)	
Play number games such as  Bingo Dominoes Number snap Shape lotto Snakes and Ladders Snap Any counting games Dice games	Read a variety of books to your child every day and remember favourites will be requested again and again!  Children should read to an adult daily.  Read books on a seaside theme such as  Sharing a shell Billy's bucket Winnie at the seaside The snail and the whale The lighthouse keepers' lunch	
Weekly Phonics Tasks (aim to do one per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (aim to do one per day)	
Watch Alpha blocks (CBeebies)	Write the alphabet –capitals and lower case	
Say the alphabet – practise saying the name of the letter and the letter sound.	Think of as many seaside words as you can for each letter of the alphabet – are there any letters you cannot find a seaside word for?
