#### Learning Projects

This half term we would like to encourage you to spend as much time outside living life in all its fullness and enjoying the world around you. Fingers crossed we will have wonderful weather!

Please choose a few of these activities to enjoy together over half term. We would love to see pictures of what you get up to.

- How many British trees can you name? Do you know what their leaves look like? Could you make a scrap book of British Trees? Maybe you could collect some leaves and dry them, write some facts about them, find out their Latin name...
- Design and make a crown celebrating nature.
- How many birds visit your garden? Can you identify them? Create a graph to show how many of which type of bird visited your garden over the course of an hour.
- If raining, make a rain gauge to collect how much rain has fallen. What can you use to help you mark millilitres on your gauge?
- We have missed the opportunity to have our school photographs taken this year, so could you take a photograph of yourself and send it to us so we can add to our Lockdown Gallery? It could be you doing some lockdown activities!
- Being as creative as possible, draw, colour or paint a picture of your time at home of something that shows 'Life in all its fullness.'
- Can you create a badge or logo to represent 'Life in all its fullness?'
- Make a journey stick during one of your walks or from collecting things from your garden.
- Look for insects in your garden. Draw them or photograph them and create a pictogram (picture graph) of your results.
- Make a bug or bee home for your garden.
- Create your own wind chime. What materials work best?
- Sit quietly and still in your garden and listen and look at nature.
- Create your own miniature garden.
- Make a den and have adventures.
- Make a sun dial and test it out.
- Make a sculpture from objects found in your garden.
- Make a time capsule and bury it in the garden
- Make a daisy chain or use grass to make a whistle.
- Blow bubbles and experiment with making different shaped bubble wands.
- Use different natural materials from the garden to paint and draw with.
