Year Reception	
Weekly Maths Tasks (aim to do one per day)	Weekly Reading Tasks (aim to do one per day)
<p>Clap and count to 100</p> <p>Practise counting in 2s</p> <p>Look at 2 numbers – which is bigger, which is smaller?</p> <p>Pick a number between 1 and 30 count back to 0</p> <p>Practise doubles</p> <p>Count and clap to 30 and back again</p> <p>Count in 2s to 30</p> <p>Show different ways of making 10 with 2 numbers</p> <p>Practise adding and subtracting. Ask the children to think of a way to record the number sentences. It can be verbal, a drawing or written or all three!</p> <p>Practise writing numbers – remember all numbers start at the top.</p>	<p>Read a variety of books to your child every day and remember favourites will be requested again and again!</p> <p>Children should read to an adult daily.</p> <p>Read Supertato and/or Super worm</p> <p>Read The Princess and the pea</p>
Weekly Phonics Tasks (aim to do one per day)	Weekly Writing Tasks (aim to do one per day)
<p>Watch Alpha blocks (CBeebies)</p> <p>Say the alphabet – practise saying the name of the letter and the letter sound.</p> <p>My name is... and I say...</p> <p>Play I Spy</p> <p>Rhyming words</p>	<p>Write the alphabet –capitals and lower case</p> <p>Letter writing on Mini mash</p> <p>Write their name –correctly forming each letter.</p> <p>Make up your own Superhero</p> <p>Think about what sort of superpowers they would have.</p> <p>Draw/write about an adventure your Superhero goes on</p>
