

The children were super proud to receive their badges!




## Zones of Regulation & World Mental Health Day

As a school this year we are focusing on supporting the children to be able to self-regulate, to be able to recognise and manage their emotions, help themselves to deal with different environments and social situations. Thus, enabling them to succeed in their learning. The children recognise these as our Zones of regulation.

There are four main zones, but it is flexible, and some children feel a range of emotions all at one time.

We too recognise children can become dysregulated, which may have an impact on their own or others learning. These children have time, space and adult support to help them regulate. In their classes the children have been thinking of different strategies that they can use when they become dysregulated and need support.

Zones of Regulation						
Colour Zone	Possible Emotions	Strategies / Tools				
Green Zone	Happy Calm Focused Ready to learn Enthusiastic	Drink water. Have a healthy snack. Have enough sleep. Have sensory breaks. Have movement breaks. Have brain breaks. Do mindfulness activities. Do yoga stretches. Lessons in Personal, Social, Health and Economic Have circle time.				
Blue Zone	Unhappy Tired Withdrawn Bored Tearful III	Stretch. Talk to somebody. Take a walk. Stand up. Close your eyes. Swing or rock gently. Do some wall push-ups. Stretch up high with your hands and then stretch down to your toes. Do some star jumps. Walk on your tiptoes				
Yellow Zone	Anxious Silly Excited Nervous Frustrated	Take time out. Take some deep breaths. Talk to somebody. Count to 20. Draw a picture. Squeeze something, like a cuddly toy. Concentrate on feeling the ground under your feet. Do some yoga stretches. Listen to some calming music. Blow bubbles				
Red Zone	Angry Frustrated Mad Yelling Aggressive Scared	Take a break. Take deep breaths. Go to a safe place or a quiet zone. Ask for help. Use a fidget object, like a stress ball. Talk about your feelings. Wrap your arms around yourself and give yourself a squeeze. Burst some bubble wrap. Scribble on scrap paper, scrunch it up into a ball and throw it in a bin.
